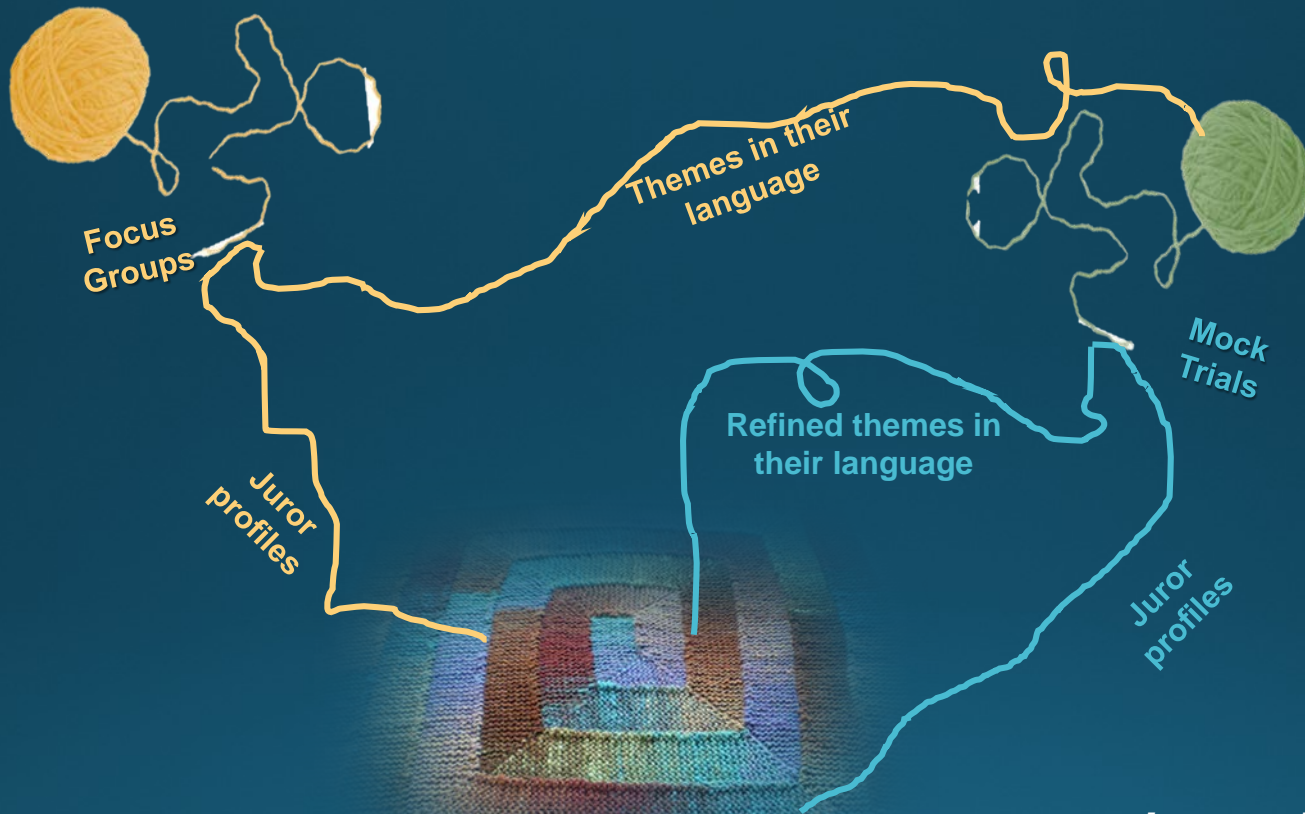
Lawyering is a performance profession.

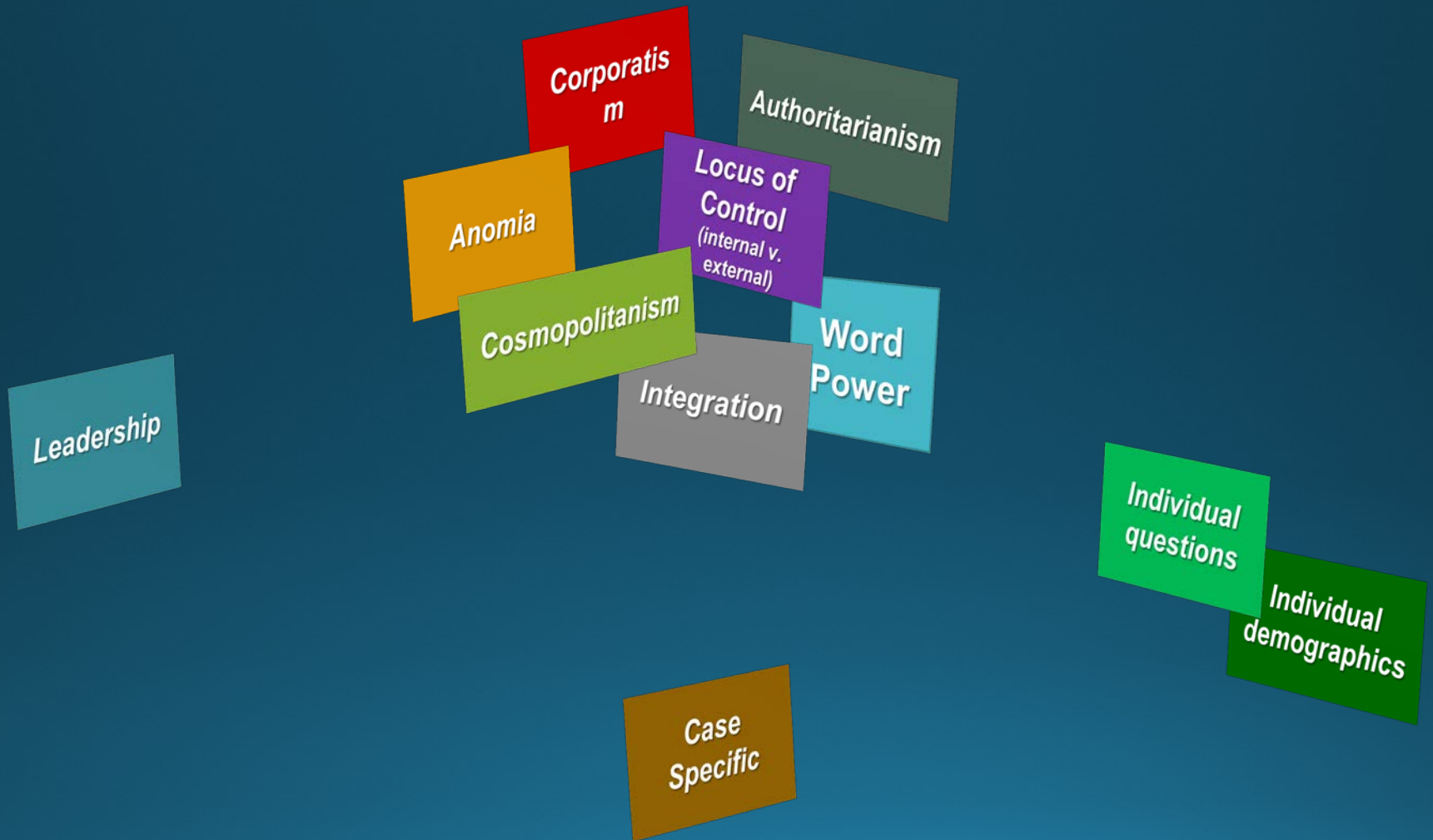

Focus groups reveal biases

- ✓ All people are biased
- ✓ Filter the issues of your case through those biases
- ✓ Watch group members defend their biases
- ✓ Begin collecting attitudinal and demographic data

3. The condition of the average person is worse today than it used to be.

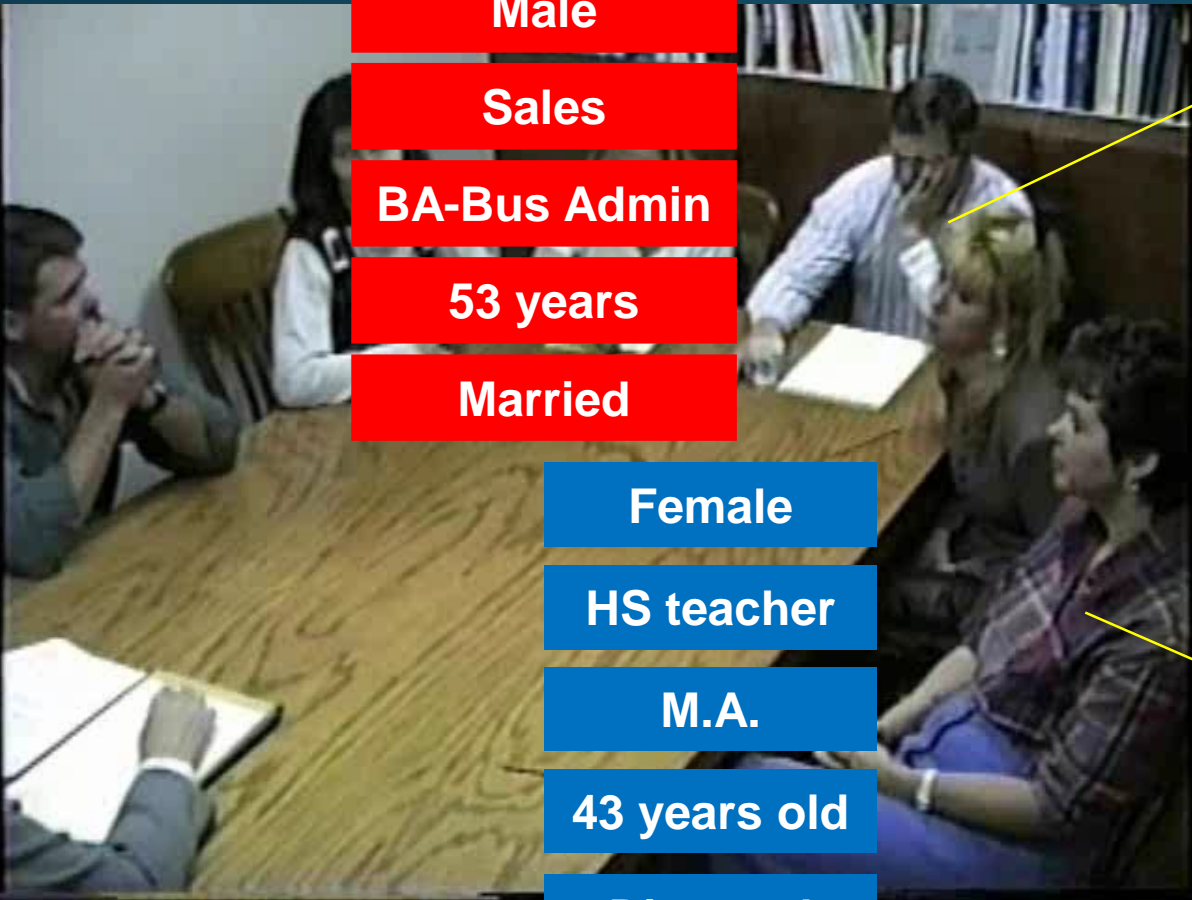

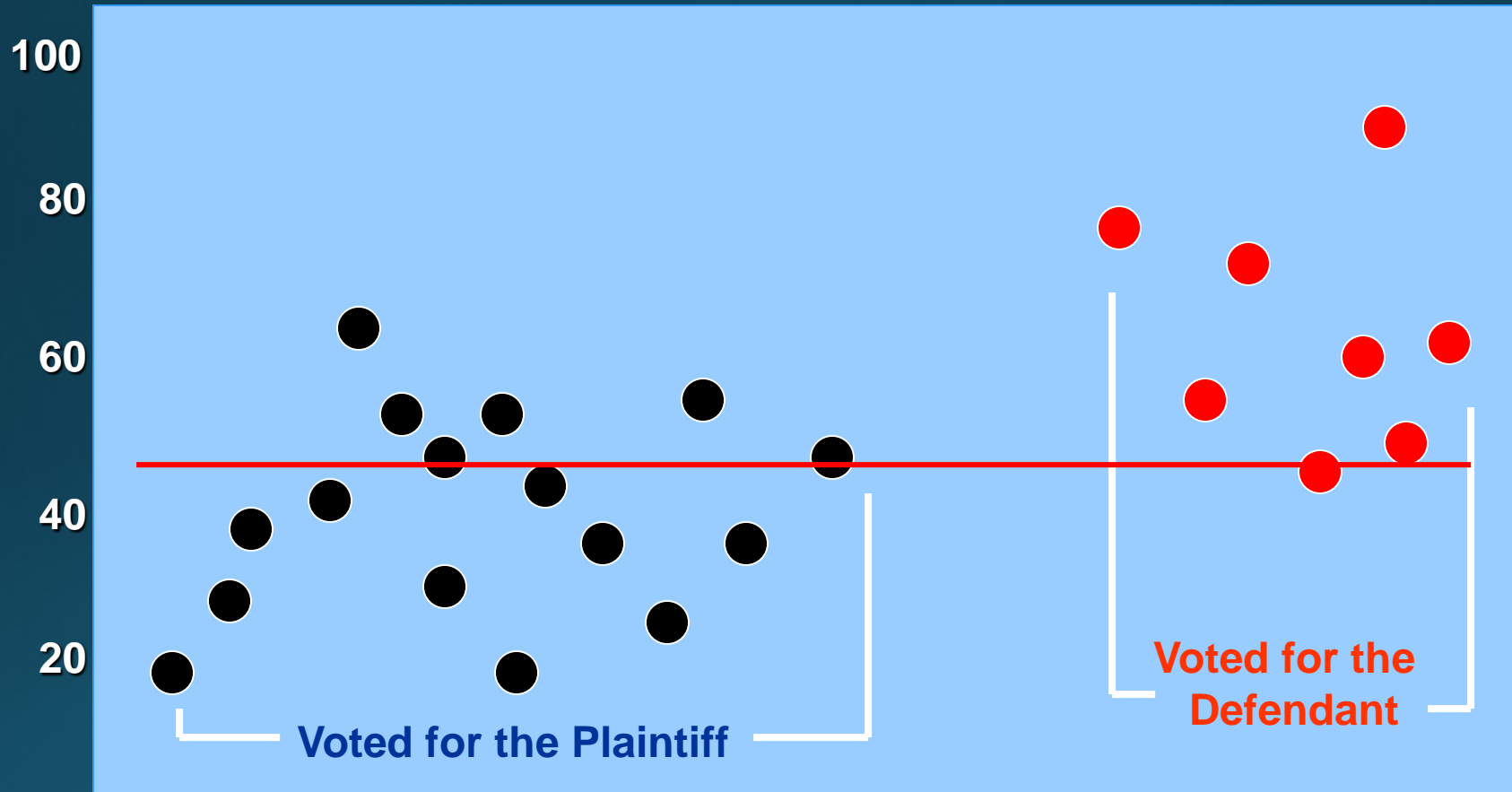

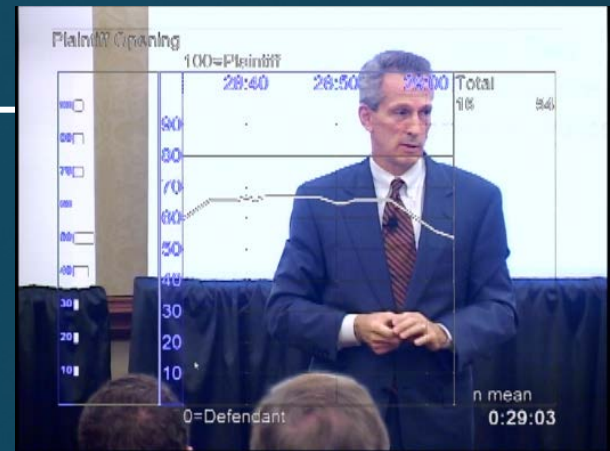
Simulated to be as close to actual trial as possible

Our mock trials generate . . .

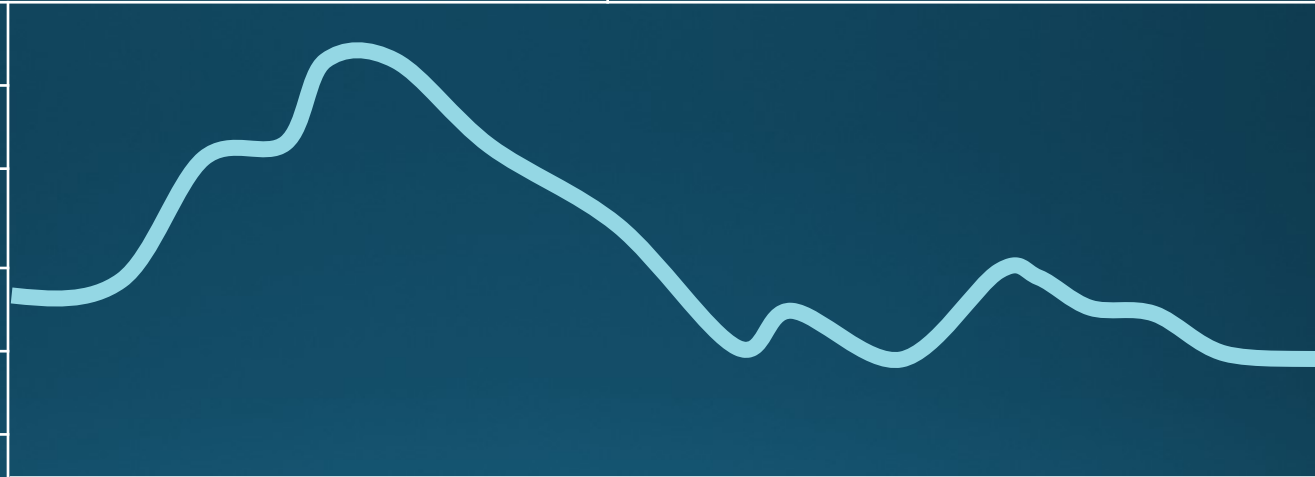
- Written feedback (surveys)

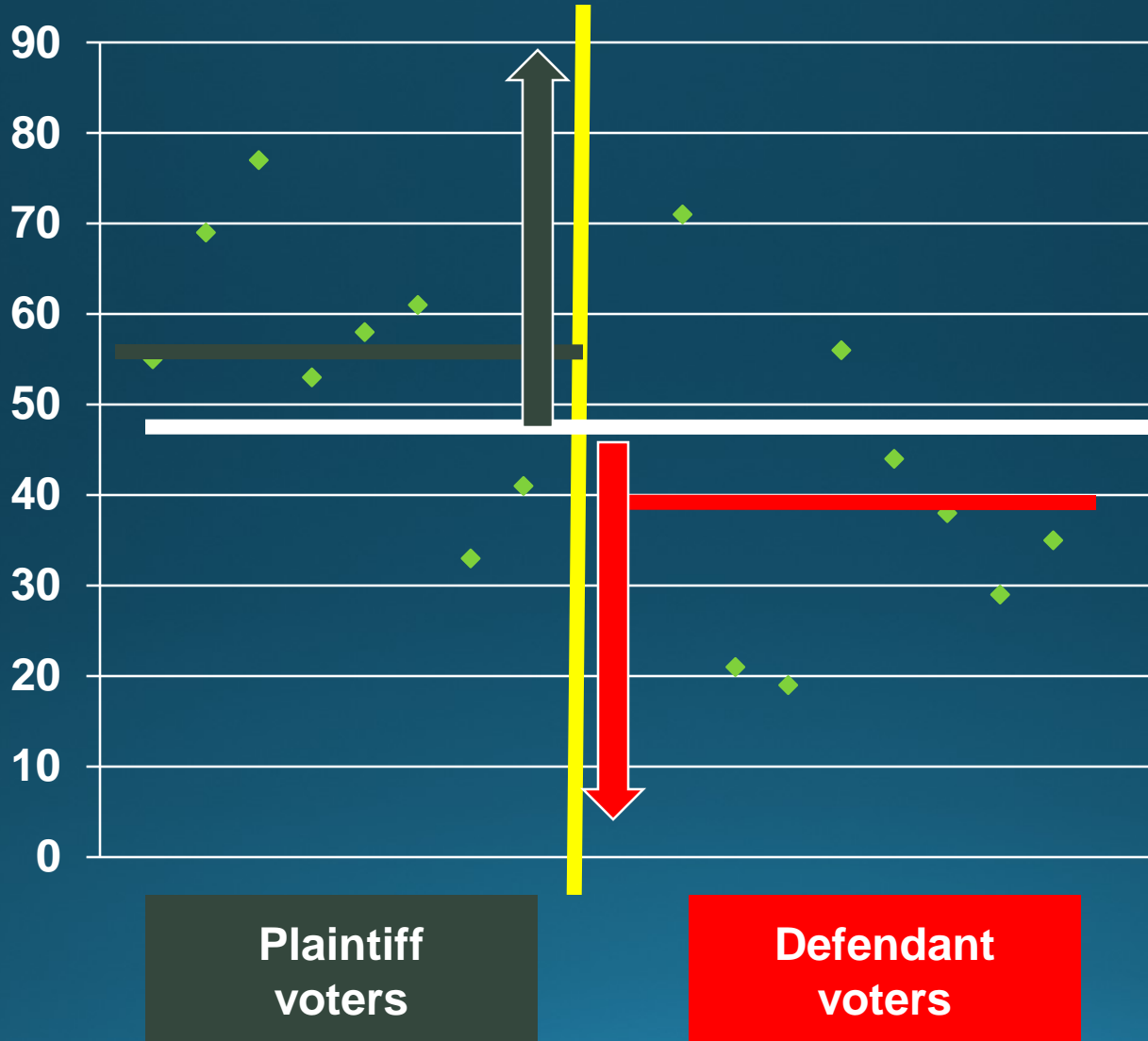
