The Ohio Association of Civil Trial Attorneys (OACTA) is pleased to announce, the OACTA Inclusion and Equity Scholarship has been renamed the **OACTA Hilary S. Taylor Inclusion and Equity Scholarship.**

Mr. Hilary S. Taylor served as chair of OACTA's Diversity Committee from 2010-2017, was a member of the OACTA Board of Trustees in 2017 and was the recipient of the OACTA Frank Seth Hurd Member of the Year Award in 2014. Under Mr. Taylor's leadership, OACTA developed a Diversity Statement, initiated a Diversity Committee, was nationally recognized

in 2011 as the recipient of the DRI (Defense Research Institute) State and Local Defense Organization Diversity Award, developed the OACTA Foundation to provide a funding source for the scholarship, and provided financial support to twenty-two (22) law students, to date, all in an effort to support and promote inclusion and equity in our profession and in the community.

OACTA Law Student Inclusion & Equity Scholarships are open to the following incoming second and third year law students who are enrolled in an Ohio law school or are a permanent Ohio resident: Minority law students; LGBTQ (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning) law students, regardless of race or ethnicity; Female law students, regardless of race or ethnicity; or, Law students from economically impoverished families/backgrounds, regardless of race or ethnicity. The criteria include academic achievements; service to the community and to the cause of inclusion and equity; and experience or interest in a civil defense practice. Since established in 2011, OACTA has distributed twenty-two (22) scholarships to students at six (6) different Ohio law schools, totaling \$32,500.

Funding for these scholarships is provided by The OACTA Foundation. The OACTA Foundation, established in 2016, is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, funding projects consistent with the mission of OACTA. The scholarship was instrumental in the development of the OACTA Foundation.

OACTA Announces the 2020 Hilary S. Taylor Law Student Inclusion & Equity Scholarship



The Ohio Association of Civil Trial Attorneys (OACTA) Law Student Inclusion & Equity Scholarship program is open to the following incoming second and third year law students who are enrolled in an Ohio law school or are a permanent Ohio resident: Minority law students;

LGBTQ (Lesbian, Bisexual, Gay, Transgender, Questioning) law students, regardless of race or ethnicity; Female law students, regardless of race or ethnicity; or, Law students from economically impoverished families/backgrounds, regardless of race or ethnicity. The criteria include academic achievements; service to the community and to the cause of inclusion and equity; and experience or interest in a civil defense practice.

Up to two (2) scholarships in the amount of \$2,500 each will be awarded to successful applicants. Applicants are required to submit an application, law school transcript and a cover letter addressing the following: academic, personal and professional accomplishments, and why they should be selected as a recipient of the scholarship. Applicants must also submit at least one letter of recommendation but may submit a total of three. Applications must be submitted online with a cover letter. Transcripts and letter of recommendation may be mailed to the OACTA office.

The completed application and all other requested material must be received by **May 15**, **2020**. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered. Scholarship recipients will be announced in June and recognized at the OACTA Annual Meeting in November. Funding is provided by the OACTA Foundation.

Ohio Supreme Court and Insurance Allocation: Pro Rata or All Sums?

Recently, in Lubrizol Advanced Materials, Inc. v. National Union Fire Ins. Co., Case No. : 1:17-cv-01782-DAP, the federal court certified the following question to the Ohio Supreme Court: "Whether an insured is permitted to seek full and complete indemnity, under a single policy coverage for 'those sums' that insured becomes legally obligated to pay because of property damage that takes place during the policy period, when the property damage occurred over multiple policy periods?" See Certification Order.

Certification and Allocation

When a federal court sits in diversity, it applies state law, see Erie R.R. Co. v. Tompkins, 304 U.S. 64, 78 (1938), and consequently is the equivalent to "another court of the State." Guar. Tr. Co. v. York, 326 U.S. 99, 108 (1945). When required to do so, a federal court will predict state law, but this is not always practical. The certification procedure is "a valuable device for securing prompt and authoritative resolution of unsettled questions of state law, especially those that seem likely to recur and to have significance beyond the interests of the parties in a particular lawsuit." Kidney v. Kolmar Laboratories, 808 F.2d 955, 957 (2d Cir. 1987). In the Lubrizol Certification Order, Judge Polster explained that this issue presented "a novel question of state law [with no] guidance from state courts." See Certification Order.

Smart Defenses For Smart Devices: Strategies for Defending Product Liability Claims Arising From Internet of Things Technology

Background

The "Internet of Things" (IoT) generally refers to the network of physical devices (or "things") that are connected to the Internet, collecting and sharing data. The IoT has digitalized the physical world and has transformed common, everyday objects into smart devices that connect everything from watches to refrigerators to the Internet. In the process, the IoT revolution has brought with it previouslyunimaginable benefits in the form of efficiency, convenience, safety, and savings, just to name a few. Many have called the rise of the IoT the third major technological revolution, behind the Industrial Revolution and the creation of the Internet. Today, there are a wide range of applications and devices that we use in our daily lives that are impacted by the IoT. With that said, at the present time we are just in the early stages of the IoT movement. In fact, some experts estimate that by 2020, the IoT will be comprised of somewhere between 20 and 50 billion connected devices.

The range of different smart devices on the market today and their associated risks raise substantial issues regarding the application of traditional product liability law to these new technologies. Importantly, many of these issues may serve as significant roadblocks to plaintiffs who seek to establish actionable product liability claims as a result of malfunctions or hacking incidents related to IoT technology, all of which can be utilized by defense counsel to defend against and defeat IoT product liability litigation.
